WHAT IS MICC?

Model International Criminal Court (MICC) is a simulation of trials before the ICC for high school and university students from all over the world.

The International Criminal Court (ICC) is the world's most sophisticated mechanism for the protection of Human Rights and rules of warfare. MICC is a project that aims to teach core principles of the ICC to high school and university students.

MICC has been growing successfully since 2005 and we owe it to the quality of the training, focus on most relevant topics and a unique experience MICC provides.

The working language of every simulation is English, and every session comprises sets of trainings, discussions and workshops with a simulation of the ICC process – preparation, trial and verdict. Bringing in students from all around the globe, MICC fosters intercultural dialogue and understanding among students of various national and social backgrounds. The goal of this work is to encourage students to study human rights and humanitarian law.

WHO CAN APPLY

Students of law/international relations and journalism or students with journalistic background can register for MICC University. For the simulation, teams of four students can register from one university. The final selection of participating teams will be made on the basis of the CVs and letters of motivation submitted. The student teams should be legally advised and coordinated by a professor from their home university, but the coordinating professor is not accompanying the group to the project.

INFORMATION ABOUT PROGRAM

The MICC University will be organized in an online format with usage of various online tools which were previously used in organization of Model International Criminal Court project activities.

Three weeks before the official start of the project on October 19th 2020, all students will be assigned into teams (judges, prosecutors, defense lawyers and press team) and will work together on creation of the position papers for the simulation. The project week (October 19th to October 24th) will consist of everyday program, which will require active participation in program activities such as lectures, discussions and simulation game in between of 4-6 hours daily.

We expect full participation of each participating during the project week and we kindly ask you before applying to take this into consideration.

Proof of level English:** Applicants whose first language is not English, and the university degree is not earned in the English language, have to demonstrate English language skills in the scope of Level B2 according to the Common European Framework (e.g. through work/study/internship experiences in an English speaking country; language of instruction of previous study program was English). However, in order to actively engage in MICC it is necessary that your knowledge of English is C1 and above.
